Staff drop-in sessions - Safe Transfer of Patients in ARI project Virtual drop-in sessions for staff are taking place each day this week between 1-2pm. Vaccination for inpatients – Aberdeen City hospitals If your ward/service has inpatients who are eligible for 'flu and/or COVID-19 vaccination, they can receive this in hospital. Vaccination for staff – walk-in clinic at ARI If you work in health or social care and have still to get your 'flu or COVID-19 jabs, there is a walk-in clinic tomorrow (Tuesday) at eye outpatients (Yellow Zone) between 9.30am-4pm. Data security - don't use unapproved apps or services Unapproved apps or online services **must never** be used to share patient or business confidential data between colleagues or to communicate with patients. This includes services like WhatsApp, FaceTime, Facebook or Facebook Messenger, Slack, Induction Switch, personal (i.e. non-NHS) email or text messaging services etc. The NHS side of the communication must always be via NHS systems like Teams, Near Me, NHS email etc. If you've got any questions, please contact gram.infogovernance@nhs.scot

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COTAG support - standard operating procedure COTAG provide emergency support to the NHS, HSCPs, local authorities etc, in times of extreme weather or civil emergency by providing 4X4 vehicle response. Their help should only be requested once all usual business continuity measures have been exhausted. The Standard Operating Procedure (SOP) has been updated; please note the HSCPs in City, Aberdeenshire, and Moray now have their own agreements with COTAG and they should follow their local policy.
