
COVID-19Brief



Here is the brief for Friday 22 April 2022.

Lateral Flow Device testing for hospital/care home visitors It remains possible for individuals who are visiting relatives or friends in hospitals or care homes to order free Lateral Flow Device tests. Test kits can be obtained by completing an online form on the GOV.UK website or by calling 119 (available 7 days a week, 7am-11pm). Test kits typically take three days to arrive once ordered. As an organisation, we are strongly encouraging anyone visiting family or friends to continue with LFD testing. We are also reminding the public COVID-19 is not the only risk and if they have other symptoms, such as vomiting, diarrhoea, muscle aches, coughing, sneezing, and/or sore throats, they should postpone planned visits.

The pandemic in Scotland and Grampian: Today's publication of the Office National Statistics Infection Survey reports a fourth consecutive weekly fall in infection levels in Scotland. For the week ending 16th April, ONS estimates 1 in 19 people were infected, compared to 1 in 17 in the previous week, and 1 in 11 at our highest in the week ending 20th March. So things look to be heading in the right direction – with similar trends seen in other UK countries. We'll be keeping a close eye on this in the coming weeks and how prevalence is affected by changes in lateral flow testing and mask wearing as a legal requirement. Hospital admissions continue to decline, with 59 in the last 7 days compared to 104 in the previous week and those being admitted FOR covid decreasing, with 9 admissions in the last week vs 25 in the previous seven days. Consequently, covid occupancy overall has reduced by 16% from last week – although remaining high at 117, comparable with hospitalisation levels experienced during the January 2021 (Delta) wave. ONS estimates of long covid suggest that approx. 15,000 people in Grampian still have symptoms 4 weeks after their first infection and almost 7,000 have had symptoms lasting longer than 1 year.
