Update – Eye protection in the amber (medium risk) pathway The recommendation that all healthcare workers providing direct care in the amber pathway should wear eye protection, at all times, has been **discontinued**. All healthcare workers in all COVID-19 pathways, should apply the recommendations within the Scottish Covid-19 IPC addendum, section 5.6 <u>National Infection Prevention and Control Manual: Scottish COVID-19 Infection Prevention and Control Addendum for Acute Settings</u>


If patients in the amber or green pathways are identified as having new / recent onset of symptoms suggestive of COVID-19, or a positive test is reported, then red (high risk) pathway principles become immediately applicable. COVID-19 vaccination programme- proof of vaccination The topic of vaccine passports has been much discussed in recent weeks. It's important to be aware that, at present, no such scheme exists. We await further guidance from the Scottish Government on the introduction of any such scheme.

Variant of Concern detected in Grampian The Incident Management Team set up in light of the detection of 3 cases of COVID-19 Variant of Concern in Grampian met again today. Tracing of contacts, and contacts of contacts locally, is now complete. This is the product of a significant amount of hard work by our local Health Protection team and their efforts must be recognised. The National Contact Tracing Centre is continuing its work to trace all passengers onboard BA Flight 1312 from Heathrow to Aberdeen on 29 January. Officials remain confident there has been no community spread of this variant.

Use of face masks/face coverings in healthcare settings – information for the public A patient information leaflet has been developed to explain to patients, carers, and visitors the current policy on wearing face masks or face coverings in healthcare settings. It is available to read here and distribution of hard copies is underway.

Grampian data The local figures for today and the 7 day rolling positivity rate are shown below. As a reminder, this rate is arrived at by dividing the number of positive tests in the past 7 days by the number of tests carried out in the past 7 days. Repeat tests are included in both categories, whereas the figures we show here only record new tests.



Webinar opportunity - Infection Prevention and Control during Covid-19 Two free webinars will be held on 9 March (1.30-3pm) and 17 March (10-11.30am), giving NHS Scotland staff the opportunity to put any concerns and questions on infection prevention and control to a panel of clinical experts and frontline staff.
