Call Before You Convey – second test of change Thank you to everyone who attended the virtual session on Tuesday, highlighting the results of the first test of change of Call Before You Convey. We will be starting a second, longer, test of change tomorrow (Friday 21 October). This will run for four weeks and, as before, prior to leaving the scene, SAS A&E crews will first contact the Grampian Flow Navigation Centre to seek senior decision-making support. International Infection Prevention Week Today we're looking at Chapter 4 of the NIPCM, which focuses on the built environment. Pathogens can be found in many hidden areas of the built environment such as water, ventilation systems, and areas where there is damp or mould growing. These pathogens can also be found on equipment which has not been decontaminated appropriately. Protect patients and yourself by flushing little used outlets, observing the 1-metre splash zone, and reporting any environmental concerns promptly. Evidence based resources / further reading is available in Chapter 4 of the NIPCM.

**Changes to disclosure system in Scotland** The Disclosure (Scotland) Act 2020 will come into effect in 2024.
