**Laundry Services** As part of the installation of a new hydraulic press in the laundry, a beam was inadvertently disturbed which produced an isolated asbestos incident. A small number of staff and contractors were in the unit at the time and have been identified and supported.

We are working swiftly to monitor air quality, identify any further/ongoing risk and to get the laundry back up and running in a safe and controlled manner. The room has been isolated and no laundry products have been affected.

This incident will have a knock-on effect to how quickly laundry will be dealt with for at least a few weeks. There are several safe things that staff in clinical settings can do to help:

- Where possible, wear your uniform and not scrubs where appropriate.
- Change beds only when needed, but ensure linen is changed within a 7 day window.
- Use any extra stored linen or pods you may have on the wards.
- And lastly, and most importantly, be respectful of the laundry staff at all times. Everyone is doing their best.

**Industrial Action – System Update** You will be aware of last week's news that industrial action by junior doctors has been suspended to allow consultation on a new pay offer. As a result, this morning the Chief Executive Team took the decision to step down the formal Gold, Silver, Bronze reporting structures that had been put in place for the time being, recognising this needs to be kept under review as negotiations continue.

We would like to thank everyone who contributed to the significant amount of planning that was undertaken ahead of time and all affected staff for their ongoing flexibility. As we reinstate activity, shift patterns and rotas should revert, wherever possible, to those scheduled prior to the industrial action and Consultants who may have been providing resident cover no longer need to do so.
