**Industrial action update** Industrial action by junior doctors has been suspended, to allow consultation on a new pay offer. The action was due to start at 7am on Wednesday 12 July and end at 6.59am on Saturday 15 July.

We want to acknowledge the huge amount of hard work undertaken in recent weeks to try and mitigate the disruption industrial action would have brought. We are incredibly grateful to everyone for their efforts. We also, at this point, wish to underline our respect for the right to take industrial action.

As many of you will already be aware, we were limiting planned activity on the industrial action days, with a focus on maintaining emergency and unplanned services, and recognising our capacity would be limited. As the action has been suspended, we are keen to restore as much capacity next week as possible; more information will follow.

As we have acknowledged many times, this has been – and will continue to be – a period of mixed emotions. Relief, anger, frustration; all are understandable. Please continue to give yourself and your colleagues the space to sit with these feelings. Please also remember to treat each other with dignity and respect. Civility is more than good manners; Civility Saves Lives.
