PRACTICE UPDATE

All patients will be aware that the Partners had made the very difficult decision to hand back their GP contract to NHS Grampian earlier this year. However, following a lot of investigating into new models of care and ways of working over the last few months, we believe we are in a unique position to be able to ensure continuity of care to patients, whilst also developing the Practice to ensure its sustainability.

We plan to further develop our multidisciplinary team and improve our internal working practices to ensure continued and sustainable excellent care to our patients. GP recruitment is still challenging, however we believe that making the changes we are planning will enable us to continue to deliver high quality care to our patients well into the future.

This is an unprecedented time for the Practice and we are excited to take forward the changes in a planned and controlled manner, enabling us to continue to provide a service whilst moving forward with our new Practice model.

STAFF UPDATE

We have had a change in our GP Trainees in February. Dr John Ajisafe has moved to his GPST2 post in Aberdeen, however will return to the Practice as a GPST3 in 2024. Dr Ayobami Dikwal started her GPST1 post with us, and will be moving into her GPST2 post in August.

We have three new reception staff – Andrea Campbell, Meghan Bruce and Louise O'Brien. All are based in our Inverurie Surgery.

There are also some changes in our GP Partners – Dr Gordon retired at the end of March after over 20 years with the Practice. Dr Finlayson left Practice at the end of March. Dr Barker will be leaving us in early September. We will miss them all and wish them all the best for the future.

Dr Maltin has returned from maternity leave and Dr Whitelaw has just started her maternity leave.

APPOINTMENT SYSTEM UPDATE

As we move out of the pandemic we have been working hard in the background to implement a new appointment system. eConsult and Near Me video consultations worked really well during the pandemic as a way for us to offer a service to our patients.

eConsult is no longer being used for general use, however this is still available for medication reviews.

We have made a big change and moved back to offering routine face to face and call back appointments with our GPs, which can be made up to a week in advance. When capacity is reached for the day, we will be asking patients to call back next day when more appointments are released for the next week.

We have a Duty Team each day of GPs, Practice Paramedics and our Advanced Nurse Practitioners. The Team deal with any issues which require assistance on the day and can't wait for the next routine appointment.

We are planning on introducing SMS text messaging to send appointment reminders, recall letters, test results and information to patients very soon. Make sure we have your up to date mobile number – please let us know it next time you call.

PHARMACY TEAM

We have a Pharmacy Team based in the Practice which consists of admin staff, pharmacy technicians and pharmacists. Usually a member of the admin team will take your call and either a technician or pharmacist will call you back depending on the nature of your query.

The Team is available to deal with all sorts of medication queries including repeat or acute medication issues, outpatient hospital letters or hospital discharges. Select **Option 5** to speak to the Pharmacy Team.

MEDICAL STUDENTS

As a Training Practice, we are pleased to be able to accommodate medical students on placement in the Practice. We have 4th year students in Rhynie surgery, and 5th year students in Inverurie. The students attend the Practice in seven week blocks during which time they work with various members of the Practice team, as well as seeing patients with GP cover.

NEW GP IT SYSTEM

The re-procurement, renewal and modernisation of existing GP clinical systems in Scotland to the next generation of centrally hosted systems is called GP IT re-provisioning. The aim of GP IT re-provisioning is to provide modern, secure GP IT systems which will support evolving models of care. We will be moving to our new IT system later in the year. There will be more information available regarding this as we get it.
